Mr. ROSE (for himself and Mr. THOMAS of California) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for the printing of a collection of statements made in tribute to the late Justice Thurgood Marshall.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That a collection of statements made in trib-
3 ute to the late Justice Thurgood Marshall, together with
4 related materials, shall be printed as a House document,
5 with illustrations and suitable binding. The collection shall
6 be prepared under the direction of the Joint Committee
7 on Printing.

8 SEC. 2. In addition to the usual number, there shall
9 be printed—

1 (1) 50,000 copies (including 1,000 casebound
2 copies) of the document, of which 33,440 copies (in-
3 cluding 440 casebound copies) shall be for the use
4 of the House of Representatives, 7,600 copies (in-
5 cluding 100 casebound copies) shall be for the use
6 of the Senate, and 8,960 copies (including 460
7 casebound copies) shall be for the use of the Joint
8 Committee on Printing; or

9 (2) such number of copies as does not exceed
10 a total production and printing cost of \$66,988, with
11 distribution to be allocated in the same proportion
12 as described in paragraph (1), except that in no case
13 shall the number of casebound copies be less than
14 one per Member of Congress.
