## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol grounds for the Greater Washington Soap Box Derby.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2        *concurring),*

3        **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF SOAP BOX DERBY RACES**  
4        **ON CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

5        The Greater Washington Soap Box Derby Associa-  
6        tion (hereinafter in this resolution referred to as the “As-

1 socation'') shall be permitted to sponsor a public event,  
2 soap box derby races, on the Capitol grounds on July 16,  
3 1994, or on such other date as the Speaker of the House  
4 of Representatives and the President pro tempore of the  
5 Senate may jointly designate.

6 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS.**

7 The event to be carried out under this resolution shall  
8 be free of admission charge to the public and arranged  
9 not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under condi-  
10 tions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and  
11 the Capitol Police Board; except that the Association shall  
12 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities  
13 incident to all activities associated with the event.

14 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

15 For the purposes of this resolution, the Association  
16 is authorized to erect upon the Capitol grounds, subject  
17 to the approval of the Architect of the Capitol, such stage,  
18 sound amplification devices, and other related structures  
19 and equipment as may be required for the event to be car-  
20 ried out under this resolution.

21 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**

22 The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police  
23 Board are authorized to make any such additional ar-  
24 rangements that may be required to carry out the event  
25 under this resolution.
