CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To express the sense of the Congress that if nominated by the Governor of New York as an estuary of national significance, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency should select and convene a management conference under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act for the lands and waters comprising the South Shore Estuary Reserve on Long Island, New York.

1 **SECTION 1. SENSE OF CONGRESS REGARDING SOUTH**
2 **SHORE ESTUARY RESERVE ON LONG ISLAND,**
3 **NEW YORK.**

4 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of the Con-
5 gress that if the Governor of the State of New York, in
6 accordance with requirements applicable under section
7 320 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33
8 U.S.C. 1330), nominates the area described in subsection
9 (b) as an estuary of national significance, then the Admin-
10 istrator of the Environmental Protection Agency should
11 select and convene a management conference for the area
12 under that section.

13 (b) AREA DESCRIBED.—The area referred to in sub-
14 section (a) is the lands and waters comprising the South
15 Shore Estuary Reserve established by the State of New
16 York, located on Long Island, New York.
