CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that the United States Embassy in Israel should, at the earliest possible date, be relocated to the city of Jerusalem.

Whereas each sovereign nation, under international law and custom, chooses its own capital city;

Whereas the state of Israel has selected Jerusalem as its capital city; and

Whereas Israel is the only country in which the United States Embassy is not located in the designated capital of the country: Now, therefore, be it
