Mr. HUGHES (for himself and Mr. REGULA) introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Post Office and Civil Service

## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Designating May 1994 as "Older Americans Month".

Whereas older Americans have contributed many years of service to their families, their communities, and the Nation;

Whereas the population of the United States contains a large percentage of older Americans, who have a wealth of knowledge and experience;

Whereas older Americans should be acknowledged for the contributions they continue to make to their communities and the Nation; and

Whereas many States and communities acknowledge the contributions of older Americans during the month of May:  
Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3 That, in recognition of the traditional designation of the  
4 month of May as “Older Americans Month” and the re-  
5 peated expression by the Congress of its appreciation and  
6 respect for the achievements of older Americans and its  
7 desire that older Americans continue to play an active role  
8 in the life of the Nation, May 1994 is designated as “Older  
9 Americans Month”, and the President is authorized and  
10 requested to issue a proclamation calling on the people of  
11 the United States to observe the month with appropriate  
12 programs, ceremonies, and activities.
