Mr. COBLE (for himself and Mr. FLAKE) introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Post Office and Civil Service

JOINT RESOLUTION

To designate August 16, 1994, as “TV Nation Day”.

Whereas television is one industry with which no other country can compete with America;

Whereas American popular culture is a major United States export;

Whereas some of the most memorable and uplifting moments in people’s lives have occurred while watching television, from the Apollo moon landing to little baby Jessica’s rescue from the well;

Whereas TV Nation will air on broadcast television in the United States, making it available, free of charge, to everyone;

Whereas TV Nation is the first American/European joint television venture, and will begin a new opportunity for similar ventures in the future;

Whereas other news magazine programs focus on what's wrong with America, TV Nation focuses on what's right;

Whereas TV Nation will help the United States economy by providing many new employment opportunities, particularly high-tech information ones; and

Whereas TV Nation employs numerous Oscar, Emmy, and Cable-Ace Award nominees and winners: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That August 16, 1994, shall be designated
