Mr. PAYNE of Virginia introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1996, the existing suspension of duty on machines designed for heat-set, stretch texturing of continuous man-made fibers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXISTING SUSPENSION OF**
4 **DUTY ON MACHINES DESIGNED FOR HEAT-**
5 **SET, STRETCH TEXTURING OF CONTINUOUS**
6 **MAN-MADE FIBERS.**

7 Heading 9902.84.44 of the Harmonized Tariff
8 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking “12/
9 31/92” and inserting “12/31/95”.

1 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section
3 1 shall take effect on the 15th day after the date of the
4 enactment of this Act.

5 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
6 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
7 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-
8 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
9 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from
10 warehouse for consumption of goods to which the amend-
11 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

12 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

13 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the
14 enactment of this Act;

15 and with respect to which there would have been a lower
16 duty if the amendment made by section 1 had applied to
17 such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated or
18 reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had oc-
19 curred on such 15th day.

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
