Mr. DUNCAN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Labor

A BILL

To authorize the provision of financial assistance to Knoxville College for the construction of the Southeast Region African American Educator Institute.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the Southeast Region Afri-
5 can American Educator Institute Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED.**

7 (a) GENERAL AUTHORITY.—In recognition of the
8 need to address the shortage of minority teaching profes-
9 sionals in the United States, the Secretary of Education

1 is authorized to provide financial assistance, in accordance
2 with the provisions of this Act, to pay all of the cost of
3 construction, and related expenses, for the establishment
4 of the Southeast Region African American Educator Insti-
5 tute at Knoxville College, located at Knoxville, Tennessee,
6 to be used as a national and regional resource and edu-
7 cation center.

8 (b) APPLICATION REQUIRED.—No financial assist-
9 ance may be made under this Act unless an application
10 is made to the Secretary of Education at such time, in
11 such manner, and containing or accompanied by such in-
12 formation, as the Secretary of Education may reasonably
13 require.

14 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

15 (a) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be appro-
16 priated \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 1992 to carry out the
17 provisions of this Act.

18 (b) AVAILABILITY.—Funds appropriated pursuant to
19 the authority of subsection (a) shall remain available until
20 expended.
