Mr. HYDE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Sergeant Major Earnest Sands (Retired),
and Roger Sands.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Ser-
5 geant Major Earnest Sands (Retired) and Roger Sands,
6 an amount of money in compensation for any damages (in-
7 cluding legal costs, as well as other economic and non-
8 economic losses incurred) arising out of the unlawful con-
9 finement and detention of Ernest Sands in Saudi Arabia
10 from August, 1991 until January, 1992. Such confine-
11 ment and detention occurred as a result of negligence,

1 misrepresentation and other unlawful actions taken by of-
2 ficials of the United States State Department and other
3 United States government officials. Such damages shall
4 be awarded to the claimants notwithstanding the defense
5 of sovereign immunity or any defense available to the
6 United States under sections 2671–2680 of title 28, Unit-
7 ed States Code.
