

1 (1) by inserting “, including teenage parents,
2 obtain educational skills and” after “help parents”;

3 (2) by redesignating paragraphs (6) and (7) as
4 (7) and (8), respectively; and

5 (3) by inserting after paragraph (5) the follow-
6 ing:

7 “(6) the provision that whenever feasible, data
8 regarding the number, age, sex, race, and ethnicity
9 of participants is collected;”.

10 (b) ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS.—Section 1055 of the
11 Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 is
12 amended—

13 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “and”;

14 (2) in paragraph (2), by striking the period and
15 inserting “; and”; and by adding at the end the fol-
16 lowing:

17 “(3) pregnant teenagers, teenage parents, and
18 the children of such teenagers.”.

19 (c) APPLICATIONS.—Paragraph (5) of section
20 1056(c) is amended—

21 (1) by striking “and” after “proficiency” and
22 inserting a comma; and

23 (2) by inserting “and teenage parents” after
24 “handicaps”.

1 **SEC. 2. SECONDARY SCHOOL PROGRAMS FOR BASIC**
2 **SKILLS IMPROVEMENT AND DROPOUT PRE-**
3 **VENTION AND REENTRY.**

4 (a) ALLOCATION.—Subsection (c) of section 1102 of
5 the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 is
6 amended by adding at the end of paragraph (2) the follow-
7 ing:

8 “(3) Each State educational agency shall allo-
9 cate not less than 25 percent of the funds available
10 to local educational agencies in the State to dropout
11 prevention and reentry programs which—

12 “(A) are specifically designed to serve
13 pregnant teenagers and teenage parents; or

14 “(B) include services or the coordination of
15 services for pregnant teenagers and teenage
16 parents.”.

17 (b) USES OF FUNDS.—Subsection (c) of section 1103
18 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
19 is amended in paragraph (4), by inserting “sex, race or
20 ethnicity,” after “number, ages,”.

21 (c) APPLICATIONS.—Subsection (b) of section 1104
22 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
23 is amended—

24 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (8), (9), (10),
25 and (11) as paragraphs (10), (11), (12), and (13),
26 respectively;

1 (2) by inserting after paragraph (7) the follow-
2 ing:

3 “(8) assure that set-aside programs for preg-
4 nant teenagers and teenage parents provide, either
5 directly or in conjunction with other programs, aca-
6 demic skills training, parenting and child develop-
7 ment classes, onsite child care or transportation to
8 a nearby facility, and an outreach program to reach
9 such teenagers;

10 “(9) assure that whenever practicable, the set-
11 aside programs for pregnant teenagers and teenage
12 parents include the provision for health care, job
13 training, other support services such as transpor-
14 tation, life skills training, mentor support, counsel-
15 ing services, scheduling flexibility, and referrals for
16 community resources;”.

17 **SEC. 3. LOCAL TARGETED ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS.**

18 Paragraph (1) of section 1531(b) of the Elementary
19 and Secondary Education Act of 1965 is amended by in-
20 serting “, pregnant teenagers and teenage parents” after
21 “dropping out”.

22 **SEC. 4. STATE AND LOCAL PLANS.**

23 (a) STATE PLANS.—Subparagraph (C) of section
24 5122(b)(2) of the Elementary and Secondary Education

1 Act of 1965 is amended by inserting “or is a parent” after
2 “pregnant”.

3 (b) LOCAL DRUG ABUSE EDUCATION AND PREVEN-
4 TION PROGRAMS.—Subsection (a) of section 5125 of the
5 Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 is
6 amended—

7 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (15) and (16)
8 as (16) and (17), respectively; and

9 (2) inserting after paragraph (14) the following:

10 “(15) programs that address the special needs
11 of pregnant teenagers and teenage parents;”.

12 **SEC. 5. ASSISTANCE TO ADDRESS SCHOOL DROPOUT PRO-**
13 **GRAMS.**

14 (a) GRANTS TO LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES.—
15 Section 6004 of the Elementary and Secondary Education
16 Act of 1965 is amended—

17 (1) by redesignating subsections (b) through (f)
18 as (c) through (g), respectively; and

19 (2) by inserting after subsection (a) the follow-
20 ing:

21 “(b) In addition to the allocation requirements of
22 subsection (a), the Secretary shall ensure that not less
23 than 25 percent of the total funds available are used to
24 develop programs specifically designed to serve pregnant
25 teenagers or teenage parents.”.

1 (b) APPLICATION.—Subparagraph (A) of section
2 6005(b)(1) of the Elementary and Secondary Education
3 Act of 1965 is amended by inserting “, and if practicable,
4 the age, sex, race and ethnicity” after “number”.

5 (c) REPORTS.—Subsection (a) of section 6008 of the
6 Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 is
7 amended by inserting “age, sex,” after “school students
8 by”.

9 **SEC. 6. ASSISTANCE TO PROVIDE BASIC SKILLS IMPROVE-**
10 **MENT.**

11 Section 6106 of the Elementary and Secondary Edu-
12 cation Act of 1965 is amended—

13 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (8), (9), and
14 (10) as paragraphs (10), (11), and (12) respectively;

15 (2) by inserting after paragraph (7) the follow-
16 ing:

17 “(8) an assurance that set-aside programs for
18 pregnant teenagers and teenage parents provide, ei-
19 ther directly or in conjunction with other programs,
20 academic skills training, parenting and child devel-
21 opment classes, onsite child care or transportation to
22 a nearby facility, and an outreach program to reach
23 such teenagers;

24 “(9) an assurance that whenever practicable,
25 the set-aside programs for pregnant teenagers and

1 teenage parents include the provision for health
2 care, job training, other support services such as
3 transportation, life skills training, mentor support,
4 counseling services, scheduling flexibility, and refer-
5 rals for community resources;”.

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
