A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1997, the previously existing suspension of duty on certain chemicals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF PREVIOUSLY EXISTING SUSPEN-**

4 **SION OF DUTY ON CERTAIN CHEMICALS.**

5 Each of the following headings of the Harmonized
6 Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended by strik-
7 ing “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/96”:

8 (1) Heading 9902.29.25 (relating to 4-Chloro-
9 2-nitroaniline).

1 (2) Heading 9902.29.42 (relating to 4-Chloro,5-
2 dimethoxyaniline).

3 (3) Heading 9902.29.45 (relating to 3,4-
4 Diaminophenetole, dihydrogen sulfate).

5 (4) Heading 9902.30.25 (relating to 6-
6 Hydroxy-2-napthoic acid).

7 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by section
9 1 shall take effect on the 15th day after the date of the
10 enactment of this Act.

11 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
12 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
13 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-
14 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
15 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from
16 warehouse for consumption of goods to which any amend-
17 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

18 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

19 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
20 actment of this Act;

21 and with respect to which there would have been no duty
22 or a lower duty if such amendment had applied to such
23 entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated or reliquidated as
24 though such entry or withdrawal had occurred on such
25 15th day.
