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## AN ACT

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for relief from the major, widespread flooding in the Midwest for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any  
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-  
5 vide emergency supplemental appropriations for relief  
6 from the major, widespread flooding in the Midwest for  
7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other  
8 purposes, namely:



1 \$80,000,000, of which \$20,000,000 shall be available only  
2 to the extent an official budget request for a specific dollar  
3 amount, that includes designation of the entire amount of  
4 the request as an emergency requirement as defined in the  
5 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of  
6 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the President to Con-  
7 gress: Provided further, That notwithstanding any other  
8 provision of law, the \$500,000 limitation on the amounts  
9 outstanding and committed to a borrower provided in para-  
10 graph 7(c)(6) of the Small Business Act shall be increased  
11 to \$1,500,000 for Presidentially-declared major disasters for  
12 recent Midwest flooding: Provided further, That notwith-  
13 standing any other provision of this Act, the amount pro-  
14 vided herein under the heading "Employment and Training  
15 Administration" for part B of title III of the Job Training  
16 Partnership Act shall be \$54,600,000, of which \$11,100,000  
17 shall be available only to the extent an official budget re-  
18 quest for a specific dollar amount, that includes designation  
19 of the entire amount of the request as an emergency require-  
20 ment as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
21 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by  
22 the President to Congress: Provided further, That notwith-  
23 standing any other provision of this Act, the amount pro-  
24 vided herein for programs and activities of the Commission  
25 on National and Community Service shall be \$4,000,000,

1 *of which \$2,000,000 shall be available only to the extent*  
2 *an official budget request for a specific dollar amount, that*  
3 *includes designation of the entire amount of the request as*  
4 *an emergency requirement as defined in the Balanced*  
5 *Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as*  
6 *amended, is transmitted by the President to Congress: Pro-*  
7 *vided further, That all of the above amounts are designated*  
8 *by Congress as emergency requirements pursuant to section*  
9 *251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency*  
10 *Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.*

11 *Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the*  
12 *following shall be the law with respect to the Commodity*  
13 *Credit Corporation.*

14 *COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION*

15 *COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION FUND*

16 *For an additional amount for the “Commodity Credit*  
17 *Corporation Fund” to cover 1993 crop losses resulting from*  
18 *damaging weather or related floods associated with the con-*  
19 *ditions (as defined in section 2251 of Public Law 101–624),*  
20 *in 1993, \$1,050,000,000, and in addition \$300,000,000,*  
21 *which shall be available only to the extent an official budget*  
22 *request for a specific dollar amount, that includes designa-*  
23 *tion of the entire amount of the request as an emergency*  
24 *requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emer-*  
25 *gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmit-*

1 *ted by the President to Congress, the total to remain avail-*  
2 *able until June 30, 1994: Provided, That from funds pre-*  
3 *viously made available in Public Law 102-368 by Presi-*  
4 *dential declaration, \$100,000,000 to remain available until*  
5 *June 30, 1994, shall be for 1993 crop losses only: Provided*  
6 *further, That if prior to April 1, 1994, the President deter-*  
7 *mines that extraordinary circumstances exist that warrant*  
8 *further assistance, the Secretary of Agriculture shall use*  
9 *such funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation as are nec-*  
10 *essary to make payments in an amount equal to 100 per-*  
11 *cent of each eligible claim as determined under title XXII*  
12 *of Public Law 101-624: Provided further, That all addi-*  
13 *tional amounts made available herein are subject to the*  
14 *terms and conditions in Public Law 101-624: Provided fur-*  
15 *ther, That Congress hereby designates the entire amount*  
16 *provided herein as an emergency requirement pursuant to*  
17 *section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-*  
18 *gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: Provided*  
19 *further, That notwithstanding any provision of Public Law*  
20 *103-50, funds provided by such Act shall not be expended*  
21 *for 1993 crop losses resulting from 1993 natural disasters,*  
22 *and claims for assistance from funds provided by that Act*  
23 *by producers with 1990, 1991, and 1992 crop losses shall*  
24 *be paid only to the extent such claims are filed by Septem-*  
25 *ber 17, 1993.*

1       (a) *The Senate finds that:*

2               (1) *Numerous atrocities have been reported on*  
3 *the conflict in the former Yugoslavia;*

4               (2) *Such atrocities against innocent civilians*  
5 *and prisoners would violate universally accepted law*  
6 *as embodied in the Geneva Conventions of August 12,*  
7 *1949 for the Protection of War Victims; the Hague*  
8 *Convention (IV) Respecting the Laws and Customs of*  
9 *War on Land and the Regulations annexed thereto of*  
10 *October 18, 1907; the Convention on the Prevention*  
11 *and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide of Decem-*  
12 *ber 9, 1948; and the Charter of the International*  
13 *Military Tribunal of August 8, 1945;*

14              (3) *In October 1992 the United Nations Security*  
15 *Council adopted Resolution 780 establishing a Com-*  
16 *mission of Experts to gather and evaluate evidence of*  
17 *such war crimes;*

18              (4) *The Commission of Experts submitted an in-*  
19 *terim report dated January 26, 1993 which concluded*  
20 *that grave breaches and other violations of inter-*  
21 *national humanitarian law had been committed in*  
22 *the territory of the former Yugoslavia, including wil-*  
23 *ful killing, "ethnic cleansing," mass killings, torture,*  
24 *rape, pillage, and destruction of civilian property, de-*

1 *struction of cultural and religious property and arbitrary arrests;*  
2

3 *(5) The Commission of Experts has been hindered in carrying out fully its legal charge because of*  
4 *insufficient resources;*  
5

6 *(6) On February 22, 1993, the United Nations Security Council adopted Resolution 808 establishing*  
7 *an international tribunal to try individuals accused*  
8 *of the commission of war crimes in the former Yugoslavia;*  
9  
10

11 *(7) On May 3, 1993, the Secretary General of the United Nations issued his report which established the*  
12 *procedures for an international war crimes tribunal;*  
13

14 *(8) The United Nations is presently in the process of selecting judges and prosecutors for the international war crimes tribunal;*  
15  
16

17 *(9) According to reports, the atrocities in the former Yugoslavia continue unabated; and*  
18

19 *(10) There is a dire need to establish promptly the tribunal and commence prosecution of alleged war*  
20 *criminals: Now, therefore.*  
21

22 *(b) The Senate hereby commends the United Nations*  
23 *for its recognition of the importance and necessity of the*  
24 *rule of law as evidenced by its establishment of an inter-*

1 *national tribunal for the prosecution of war crimes in the*  
2 *former Yugoslavia.*

3 *(c) It is the sense of the Senate that the United Nations*  
4 *should—*

5 *(1) expedite the selection of judges and prosecu-*  
6 *tors for the tribunal in order to begin prosecutions of*  
7 *alleged war criminals; and*

8 *(2) provide all assistance necessary to continue*  
9 *gathering evidence for such prosecutions.*

16 ccurring prior to August 1, 1993, and natural disasters as  
17 declared by the President occurring in calendar year 1993,  
18 ~~(2)\$850,000,000~~ \$1,050,000,000, and in addition  
19 \$300,000,000, which shall be available only to the extent  
20 an official budget request for a specific dollar amount,  
21 that includes designation of the entire amount of the re-  
22 quest as an emergency requirement as defined in the Bal-  
23 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,  
24 as amended, is transmitted by the President to Congress,  
25 the total to remain available until June 30, 1994: *Pro-*

1 *vided*, That from funds previously made available in Public  
2 Law 102-368 by Presidential declaration, \$100,000,000  
3 to remain available until ~~(3) March 31~~ *June 30*, 1994,  
4 shall be for 1993 crop losses only: *Provided further*, That  
5 if prior to April 1, 1994, the President determines that  
6 extraordinary circumstances exist that warrant further as-  
7 sistance, the Secretary of Agriculture shall use such funds  
8 of the Commodity Credit Corporation as are necessary to  
9 make payments in an amount equal to 50.04 percent of  
10 each eligible claim as determined under title XXII of Pub-  
11 lic Law 101-624 and to make payments for catastrophic  
12 losses where the deficiency in production of the crop ex-  
13 ceeds 75 percent: *Provided further*, That all additional  
14 amounts made available herein are subject to the terms  
15 and conditions in Public Law 101-624: *Provided further*,  
16 That no payments to producers under this Act shall be  
17 at a rate greater than 50.04 percent of each eligible claim,  
18 except that for the deficiency in production of the crop  
19 in excess of 75 percent, the rate of payment shall be 90  
20 percent: *Provided further*, That Congress hereby des-  
21 ignates the entire amount provided herein as an emer-  
22 gency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of  
23 the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act  
24 of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, That notwith-  
25 standing any provision of Public Law 103-50, funds pro-

1 vided by such Act shall not be expended for 1993 crop  
 2 losses resulting from 1993 natural disasters, and claims  
 3 for assistance from funds provided by that Act by produc-  
 4 ers with 1990, 1991, and 1992 crop losses shall be paid  
 5 only to the extent such claims are filed by September 17,  
 6 1993.

9 For an additional amount to repair damages to the  
 10 waterways and watersheds resulting from the Midwest  
 11 floods and other natural disasters of 1993,

 13 ~~(5)June~~ September 30, 1994 to carry out the Emergency  
 14 Watershed Protection Program of the Soil Conservation  
 15 Service~~(6)~~, of which \$25,000,000, shall be available only  
 16 to the extent an official budget request for a specific dollar  
 17 amount, that includes designation of the entire amount of  
 18 the request as an emergency requirement as defined in the  
 19 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of  
 20 1985, is transmitted by the President to Congress: Provided,  
 21 That the entire amount is designated by Congress as an  
 22 emergency requirement pursuant to section  
 23 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
 24 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended~~(7)~~: Provided fur-  
 25 ther, That if the Secretary determines that the cost of land

21 *gency requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and*  
22 *Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, is transmitted by*
