## AN ACT

To amend title 39, United States Code, to make applicable with respect to the United States Postal Service certain exclusionary authority relating to the treatment of reemployed annuitants under the civil service retirement laws, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXCLUSIONARY AUTHORITY.**

4        Section 1005(d) of title 39, United States Code, is  
5        amended—

6                (1) by striking “(d)” and inserting “(d)(1)”;

7        and

8                (2) by adding at the end the following:

9                “(2) The provisions of subsections (i) and (l)(2) of  
10        section 8344, and of subsections (f) and (i)(2) of section  
11        8468, of title 5 shall apply with respect to the Postal Serv-  
12        ice. For purposes of so applying such provisions—

1           “(A) any reference in such provisions to the  
2 head of an Executive agency shall be considered a  
3 reference to the Postmaster General; and

4           “(B) any reference in such provisions to an em-  
5 ployee shall be considered a reference to an officer  
6 or employee of the Postal Service.”.

7 **SEC. 2. ASSIGNMENT AUTHORITY.**

8           Section 8706(e) of title 5, United States Code, is  
9 amended—

10           (1) by striking “Federal judge” and inserting  
11 “employee or former employee”;

12           (2) by striking “judge’s” and inserting “em-  
13 ployee’s or former employee’s”; and

14           (3) by striking “purchase” and inserting “pur-  
15 chased”.
