A BILL

To amend the Illinois and Michigan Canal Heritage Corridor
Act of 1984 to modify the boundaries of the corridor,
and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF BOUNDARIES.**

4 Section 104(b)(1) of the Illinois and Michigan Canal
5 National Heritage Corridor Act of 1984 (16 U.S.C. 461
6 note) is amended to read as follows:

7 “(1) The corridor shall consist of the areas depicted
8 on—

1 “(A) the map entitled ‘Illinois and Michigan
2 Canal National Heritage Corridor’, dated May 1983
3 and numbered IMC-80,000;

4 “(B) the map entitled ‘Illinois and Michigan
5 Canal National Heritage Corridor—Boundary Defi-
6 nition for portions of the Corridor East of Harlem
7 Avenue’, dated ----- and numbered -----;
8 and

9 “(C) the map entitled ‘Illinois and Michigan
10 Canal National Heritage Corridor—Boundary Defi-
11 nition for the Lake Renwick Zone’, dated -----
12 and numbered -----,

13 which maps shall be on file and available for public inspec-
14 tion in the offices of the Commission and in the offices
15 of the National Park Service.”.

16 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF COMMISSION.**

17 Section 111(a) of the Illinois and Michigan Canal Na-
18 tional Heritage Corridor Act of 1984 (98 Stat. 1456; 16
19 U.S.C. 461 note) is amended by striking out “ten” and
20 inserting “20”.
