Mr. SOLOMON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To direct the President to impose certain limitations on the amount of milk protein products that may be imported into the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That to ensure that quantities of milk protein products
4 imported into the United States will not render ineffective,
5 or materially interfere with, price support operations un-
6 dertaken by the Department of Agriculture under the Ag-
7 ricultural Act of 1949 (7 U.S.C. 1441 et seq.), the Presi-
8 dent shall by proclamation limit the quantity of milk pro-
9 tein products, including casein, caseinates, lactalbumin,
10 and whey protein concentrates, or mixtures containing not

1 less than 5 per centum of such products, which may be
2 entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption,
3 in any calendar year (or portion of a calendar year in the
4 case of the calendar year in which this Act is enacted)
5 during the period beginning on the day after the date of
6 the enactment of this Act and ending December 31, 1994,
7 to a quantity equal to 50 per centum of the average of
8 the quantity of such milk protein products annually im-
9 ported into the United States during the period beginning
10 January 1, 1983, and ending December 1, 1987 (or, in
11 the case of such portion of a calendar year, a proportion-
12 ately lesser quantity). Such proclamation shall be consid-
13 ered a proclamation which is issued by the President
14 under section 22 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act (7
15 U.S.C. 624) and which meets the requirements of such
16 section.
