## A BILL

To codify regulations restricting the sale and donation of  
excess firearms owned or held by Federal agencies.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Excess Federal Fire-  
5 arms Act of 1994”.

6 **SEC. 2. RESTRICTIONS ON SALE AND DONATION OF EXCESS**  
7 **FIREARMS OWNED OR HELD BY FEDERAL**  
8 **AGENCIES.**

9 (a) RESTRICTIONS ON SALE AND DONATION OF EX-  
10 CESS FIREARMS.—A Federal agency that owns or holds

1 an excess firearm may dispose of it only in accordance  
2 with subpart 101–42.1102–10 of title 41, Code of Federal  
3 Regulations (establishing restrictions on sales and dona-  
4 tions of excess firearms by Federal agencies), as in effect  
5 on the date of the enactment of this Act, and other sub-  
6 parts of that title referred to in that subpart (as in effect  
7 on that date).

8 (b) LIMITATION ON WAIVERS BY ADMINISTRATOR OR  
9 GENERAL SERVICES.—Notwithstanding any other law or  
10 regulation, the Administrator of General Services may not  
11 waive or otherwise authorize any deviation from any sub-  
12 part referred to in subsection (a) with respect to the dis-  
13 posal of excess firearms.

14 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, each of the terms  
15 “excess firearm” and “firearm” has the meaning that ap-  
16 plies in subpart 101–42.001 of title 41, Code of Federal  
17 Regulations.
