## A BILL

To prohibit the admission to the United States as refugees individuals who served in the armed forces of Iraq during the Persian Gulf conflict, and to deport any such individuals who have been so admitted.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION OF IRAQI SOLDIERS AS REFU-**  
4       **GEES.**

5       (a) PROHIBITION ON ADMISSION.—Notwithstanding  
6 any other provision of law, an individual who served in  
7 the armed forces of Iraq during the Persian Gulf conflict

1 may not be admitted to the United States as a refugee  
2 under the Immigration and Nationality Act.

3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICATION.—

4 (1) Subsection (a) shall be deemed to have  
5 taken effect on August 2, 1990.

6 (2) An individual who has been admitted to the  
7 United States as a refugee, but would be ineligible  
8 for admission under subsection (a), shall have such  
9 refugee status revoked and shall be deported.

10 (c) PERSIAN GULF CONFLICT DEFINED.—For pur-  
11 poses of this section, the term “Persian Gulf conflict”  
12 means the period beginning on August 2, 1990 and ending  
13 on February 27, 1991.
