## A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to increase the authorization for the development company program, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
 2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
 3       Section 20(i)(2)(C) of the Small Business Act (15  
 4 U.S.C. 631(i)(2)(C)) is amended by striking

1 “\$1,200,000,000” and by inserting in lieu thereof  
2 “\$1,500,000,000”.

3 **SECTION 1. DEVELOPMENT COMPANY LOANS.**

4 *Section 20(i)(2) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.*  
5 *631 note) is amended—*

6 *(1) by striking “\$8,458,000,000” and inserting*  
7 *“\$8,758,000,000”; and*

8 *(2) by striking “\$1,200,000,000” and inserting*  
9 *“\$1,500,000,000”.*

10 **SEC. 2. DISASTER LOAN PERSONNEL.**

11 *Section 5(b)(8) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.*  
12 *634(b)(8)) is amended by striking the semicolon and insert-*  
13 *ing the following: “: Provided, That the Administrator may*  
14 *extend the six-month limitation for an additional six*  
15 *months if the Administrator determines the extension is*  
16 *necessary to continue efficient disaster loan making*  
17 *activities;”.*
