## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to issue regulations concerning use of the term “fresh” in the labeling of poultry, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        **SECTION 1. REGULATIONS ON LABELING OF POULTRY.**

4        Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment  
5        of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture shall issue final  
6        regulations under the Poultry Product Inspection Act (21  
7        U.S.C. 451 et seq.) that prohibit the use of the term  
8        “fresh” on labeling of any poultry or poultry part, or of  
9        any edible portion of the poultry or part, that has been

- 1 frozen or previously frozen to below 26 degrees Fahrenheit
- 2 at the center of the poultry, part, or portion.
