A BILL

To amend the Perishable Agricultural Commodities Act, 1930, to prevent the imputation to cooperatives of conduct by their members and affiliates for the purposes of the prohibition relating to labelling of certain commodities.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Perishable Agricultural
5 Commodities Amendment Act of 1992”.

1 **SEC. 2. CERTAIN CONDUCT OF MEMBERS AND AFFILIATES**
2 **NOT TO BE IMPUTED TO COOPERATIVES.**

3 Section 2 of the Perishable Agricultural Commodities
4 Act, 1930, is amended—

5 (1) by inserting “(a) IN GENERAL.—” before
6 “It shall be unlawful”; and

7 (2) by adding at the end the following:

8 “(b) SPECIAL RULE RELATING TO COOPERATIVES.—
9 A cooperative association, as defined in section 15(a) of
10 the Agricultural Marketing Act, shall not be deemed to
11 have violated subsection (a)(5) by reason of the conduct
12 of a member or affiliate of that cooperative association.”.
