A BILL

Entitled, the “California-Mexico Border Drug Trafficking Reduction Act”.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RESTRICTIONS ON LAND LOCATED ALONG THE**
4 **UNITED STATES-MEXICO BORDER IN THE**
5 **STATE OF CALIFORNIA.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—In order to carry out the purposes
7 of section 287(a)(3) of the Immigration and Nationality
8 Act (8 U.S.C. 1357(a)(3)), the Attorney General shall
9 take such action as is necessary to—

1 (1) acquire a permanent easement for the Unit-
2 ed States extending 50 feet outwards along the
3 length of the United States-Mexico border in the
4 State of California for the purpose of erecting and
5 maintaining a security fence and access road; and

6 (2) establish a 500 foot setback located along
7 the length of the border described in paragraph (1)
8 for the purpose of restricting any development with-
9 in such setback.
