Mr. ENGLISH of Oklahoma introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Energy and Commerce and Public Works and Transportation

A BILL

To amend the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 to require certain States to contribute to other States' shares of cleanup costs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT FOR CERTAIN STATES TO CON-**
4 **TRIBUTE TO SUPERFUND CLEANUP COSTS.**

5 Section 104(c) of the Comprehensive Environmental
6 Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42
7 U.S.C. 9604(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
8 lowing:

1 “(4)(A) For purposes of clause (i) of paragraph
2 (3)(C), in the case of a remedial action at a facility at
3 which a hazardous waste was disposed of, if such waste
4 was generated in another State, the State in which the
5 facility is located may recover the amount described in
6 subparagraph (B) from such other State. Such other State
7 shall pay such amount to the State in which the facility
8 is located.

9 “(B) The amount referred to in subparagraph (A) is
10 that share of the amount the State in which the facility
11 is located will pay or assure payment of under clause (i)
12 of paragraph (3)(C) that is attributable to the remedial
13 action costs associated with the hazardous waste disposed
14 of at the facility but generated in the other State.”.
