A BILL

To provide for the conduct of basic research on certain matters relating to ovarian cancer.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ovarian Cancer Re-
5 search Act of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT REGARDING CERTAIN CATEGORIES**

7 **OF BASIC RESEARCH ON OVARIAN CANCER.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and
9 Human Services, acting through the Director of the Na-
10 tional Institutes of Health and the Director of the Na-

1 tional Cancer Institute, shall conduct or support basic re-
2 search—

3 (1) to develop a test capable of detecting ovar-
4 ian cancer in the earlier stages of the cancer; and

5 (2) to determine whether there is a genetic
6 basis to such cancer.

7 (b) LIMITATION.—In carrying out subsection (a), the
8 Secretary may not conduct or support clinical research re-
9 garding the matters described in paragraph (1) or (2) of
10 such subsection.

11 **SEC. 3. FUNDING.**

12 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the
13 purpose of carrying out section 2(a), there is authorized
14 to be appropriated \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 1994,
15 \$60,000,000 for fiscal year 1995, \$70,000,000 for fiscal
16 year 1996, \$80,000,000 for fiscal year 1997, and
17 \$90,000,000 for fiscal year 1998.

18 (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION REGARDING OTHER
19 AUTHORIZATIONS.—Subsection (a) may not be construed
20 to affect the authority to make, under any authorization
21 of appropriations established in any other provision of law,
22 appropriations for the purposes described in section 2(a).

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
