RESOLUTION

Objection to any further increase in the inland waterway fuel tax.

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-
2 resentatives that—

3 (1) the inland waterway fuel tax should not be
4 increased beyond those increases that are scheduled
5 under current law; and

6 (2) the recently passed H. Con. Res. 64 (setting
7 forth the budget of the United States Government
8 for fiscal year 1994 through 1998) should not be

1 considered to assume any increase in the inland wa-
2 terway fuel tax beyond the scheduled increases re-
3 ferred to in paragraph (1).
