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## RESOLUTION

Providing for further consideration of the bill (H.R. 2333) to authorize appropriations for the Department of State, the United States Information Agency, and related agencies, to authorize appropriations for foreign assistance programs, and for other purposes, and for further consideration of the bill (H.R. 2404) to authorize appropriations for foreign assistance programs, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for further  
5 consideration of the bill (H.R. 2333) to authorize appro-  
6 priations for the Department of State, the United States  
7 Information Agency, and related agencies, to authorize ap-  
8 propriations for foreign assistance programs, and for other  
9 purposes. No further general debate shall be in order. The  
10 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
11 minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original  
12 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute  
13 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-  
14 ommended by the Committee on Foreign Affairs now  
15 printed in the bill, modified by the amendments printed  
16 in part 1 of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-  
17 panying this resolution. The committee amendment in the  
18 nature of a substitute, as modified, shall be considered as  
19 read. All points of order against the committee amend-  
20 ment in the nature of a substitute, as modified, are  
21 waived. No amendment to the committee amendment in  
22 the nature of a substitute, as modified, shall be in order  
23 except those printed in part 2 of the report of the Commit-  
24 tee on Rules accompanying this resolution and amend-  
25 ments en bloc described in this resolution. Amendments

1 printed in part 2 of the report may be offered only in the  
2 order printed, may be offered only by the named pro-  
3 ponent or a designee, shall be considered as read, shall  
4 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally  
5 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,  
6 shall not be subject to amendment except as specified in  
7 the report, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-  
8 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee  
9 of the Whole. All points of order against amendments  
10 printed in part 2 of the report are waived. It shall be in  
11 order at any time for the chairman of the Committee on  
12 Foreign Affairs of his designee to offer amendments en  
13 bloc consisting of amendments printed in part 2 of the  
14 report or germane modifications thereof. Such amend-  
15 ments en bloc shall be considered as read except that  
16 modifications shall be reported; shall be debatable for ten  
17 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman  
18 and ranking minority member of the Committee on For-  
19 eign Affairs or their respective designees; shall not be sub-  
20 ject to amendment; and shall not be subject to a demand  
21 for division of the question in the House or in the Commit-  
22 tee of the Whole. All points of order against such amend-  
23 ments en bloc are waived. The original proponent of an  
24 amendment included in amendments en bloc may insert  
25 a statement in the Congressional Record immediately be-

1 fore the disposition of the amendments en bloc. At the  
2 conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the  
3 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with  
4 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member  
5 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-  
6 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill  
7 or to the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-  
8 stitute, as modified. The previous question shall be consid-  
9 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to  
10 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-  
11 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

12       SEC. 2. At any time after the adoption of this resolu-  
13 tion the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of rule  
14 XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of  
15 the Whole House on the state of the Union for further  
16 consideration of the bill (H.R. 2404) to authorize appro-  
17 priations for foreign assistance programs, and for other  
18 purposes. No further general debate shall be in order. The  
19 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
20 minute rule and shall be considered as read. No amend-  
21 ment shall be in order except those printed in part 3 of  
22 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this  
23 resolution and amendments en bloc described in this reso-  
24 lution. Amendments printed in part 3 of the report may  
25 be offered only in the order printed, may be offered only

1 by the named proponent or a designee, shall be considered  
2 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the  
3 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and  
4 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment except  
5 as specified in the report, and shall not be subject to a  
6 demand for division of the question in the House or in  
7 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against  
8 amendments printed in part 3 of the report are waived.  
9 It shall be in order at any time for the chairman of the  
10 Committee on Foreign Affairs or his designee to offer  
11 amendments en bloc consisting of amendments printed in  
12 part 3 of the report or germane modifications thereof.  
13 Such amendments en bloc shall be considered as read ex-  
14 cept that modifications shall be reported; shall be debat-  
15 able for ten minutes equally divided and controlled by the  
16 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee  
17 on Foreign Affairs or their respective designees; shall not  
18 be subject to amendment; and shall not be subject to a  
19 demand for division of the question in the House or in  
20 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against  
21 such amendments en bloc are waived. The original pro-  
22 ponent of an amendment included in amendments en bloc  
23 may insert a statement in the Congressional Record imme-  
24 diately before the disposition of the amendments en bloc.  
25 At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amend-

1 ment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the  
2 House with such amendments as may have been adopted.  
3 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
4 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without  
5 intervening motion except one motion to recommit.

6       SEC. 3. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
7 may postpone until a time during further consideration  
8 in the Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded  
9 vote on any amendment made in order by this resolution.  
10 The chairman of the Committee of the Whole may reduce  
11 to not less than five minutes the time for voting by elec-  
12 tronic device on any postponed question that immediately  
13 follows another vote by electronic device without interven-  
14 ing business: *Provided*, That the time for voting by elec-  
15 tronic device on the first in any series of questions shall  
16 be not less than fifteen minutes.
