Mr. MOAKLEY, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3345) to amend title 5, United States Code, to eliminate certain restrictions on employee training; to provide temporary authority to agencies relating to voluntary separation incentive payments, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3345) to amend title 5, United

1 States Code, to eliminate certain restrictions on employee
2 training; to provide temporary authority to agencies relat-
3 ing to voluntary separation incentive payments; and for
4 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
5 pensed with. All points of order against consideration of
6 the bill are waived. General debate shall be confined to
7 the bill and the amendments made in order by this resolu-
8 tion and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
9 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
10 the Committee on Post Office and Civil Service. After gen-
11 eral debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
12 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider
13 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under
14 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
15 stitute printed in part 1 of the report of the Committee
16 on Rules accompanying this resolution. The amendment
17 in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read.
18 No amendment to the amendment in the nature of a sub-
19 stitute shall be in order except the amendment printed in
20 part 2 of the report of the Committee on Rules, which
21 may be offered only by a Member designated in the report,
22 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time
23 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by
24 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
25 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-

1 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee
2 of the Whole. All points of order against the amendments
3 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules are
4 waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
5 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
6 to the House with such amendments as may have been
7 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the
8 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of
9 the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the nature
10 of a substitute made in order as original text. The previous
11 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
12 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
13 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
14 structions.
