RESOLUTION

To request a conference with the Senate on an amendment of the House to the bill (S. 636) to amend the Public Health Service Act to permit individuals to have freedom of access to certain medical clinics and facilities, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to take from the Speaker's table the
3 bill (S. 636) to amend the Public Health Service Act to
4 permit individuals to have freedom of access to certain
5 medical clinics and facilities, and for other purposes, and

1 to consider the Senate bill in the House. All points of
2 order against the Senate bill and against its consideration
3 are waived. It shall be in order to move to strike all after
4 the enacting clause of the Senate bill and to insert in lieu
5 thereof the provisions of H.R. 796 as passed by the House.
6 All points of order against that motion are waived. If the
7 motion is adopted and the Senate bill, as amended, is
8 passed, then it shall be in order to move that the House
9 insist on its amendments to S. 636 and request a con-
10 ference with the Senate thereon.
