**A BILL**

For the relief of Fanie Phily Mateo Angeles.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That, notwithstanding any provision of the Immigration  
4       and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Fanie Phily  
5       Mateo Angeles shall be held and considered to have been  
6       lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent resi-  
7       dence as of the date of the enactment of this Act upon  
8       payment of the required visa fee. Upon the granting of  
9       permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this

1 Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer  
2 to reduce by the proper number, during the current fiscal  
3 year or the fiscal year next following, the total number  
4 of immigrant visas which are made available to natives  
5 of the country of the alien's birth under section 203(a)  
6 of such Act, or if applicable, the total number of immi-  
7 grant visas which are made available to natives of the  
8 country of the alien's birth under section 202(e) of such  
9 Act.
