Mr. THURMOND introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

For the relief of Horace Martin.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SATISFACTION OF CLAIM AGAINST THE UNITED**  
4 **STATES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Treasury is  
6 authorized and directed to pay, out of money not otherwise  
7 appropriated, to Horace Martin, of Conway, South Caro-  
8 lina, the sum of \$56,000 for the return of monies paid  
9 to the United States by Horace Martin for the purchase  
10 of a tract of property at a tax sale conducted by the Inter-  
11 nal Revenue Service.

1 (b) CONDITION OF PAYMENT.—The payment of this  
2 sum shall be in full satisfaction of all claims of Horace  
3 Martin against the United States arising out of such sale.

4 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON FEES.**

5 No part of the amount appropriated by this Act in  
6 excess of 10 percent thereof shall be paid or delivered to  
7 or received by any agent or attorney on account of services  
8 rendered in connection with this claim, any contract to the  
9 contrary notwithstanding. Violation of the provisions of  
10 this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to  
11 exceed \$1,000.
