## A BILL

To prohibit a suspension of the Act of March 3, 1931 (commonly known as the “Davis-Bacon Act”) in the State of Hawaii.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        This Act may be cited as the “Hawaii Fair Wage Act  
5        of 1993”.

6        **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON SUSPENSION.**

7        Notwithstanding section 6 of the Act of March 3,  
8        1931 (commonly known as the “Davis-Bacon Act”) (49  
9        Stat. 1011, chapter 825; 40 U.S.C. 276a–5), the Presi-  
10        dent shall not suspend the provisions of such Act within

1 the State of Hawaii in response to the national emergency  
2 caused by Hurricane Iniki in September 1992.

3 **SEC. 3. AMENDMENT.**

4 The President shall by proclamation amend Procla-  
5 mation No. 6491 (57 Fed. Reg. 47,553; relating to sus-  
6 pension of the Act of March 3, 1931, within a limited geo-  
7 graphic area in response to the national emergency caused  
8 by Hurricanes Andrew and Iniki) to eliminate all ref-  
9 erences to the State of Hawaii and Hurricane Iniki.
