A BILL

To provide that producers are eligible to receive disaster payments for the 1993, 1994, and 1995 crops of papaya that would have been harvested if the plants had not been destroyed, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Papaya Disaster
5 Assistance Act of 1994”.

6 **SEC. 2. DISASTER ASSISTANCE FOR PAPAYA PRODUCERS.**

7 The second proviso of the matter under the heading
8 “DISASTER ASSISTANCE” under the heading “COMMODITY

1 CREDIT CORPORATION” of chapter I of the Supplemental
2 Appropriations Act of 1993 (Public Law 103–50; 107
3 Stat. 241) is amended by inserting before the colon at the
4 end the following: “, including payments to producers for
5 the 1993, 1994, and 1995 crops of papaya that (1) would
6 have been harvested if the plants had not been destroyed,
7 and (2) would not have produced fruit for a lifetime total
8 of more than 3 crop years based on normal cultivation
9 practices, except that the payments shall be made only to
10 the extent that claims for the payments are filed not later
11 than the date that is 60 days after the date of enactment
12 of the Papaya Disaster Assistance Act of 1994”.
