To authorize Federal departments, agencies, and instrumentalities to retain revenues from the sale of materials collected for the purpose of recycling, and for other purposes.

Mr. McCONNELL introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Governmental Affairs

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## A BILL

To authorize Federal departments, agencies, and instrumentalities to retain revenues from the sale of materials collected for the purpose of recycling, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This section may be cited as the “Federal Recycling  
5       Incentive Act”.

6       **2. RECYCLING.**

7       Subtitle F of the Solid Waste Disposal Act is  
8       amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

1 “FEDERAL AGENCIES

2 “SEC. 6005. (a) PROCEEDS FROM SALE OF MATE-  
3 RIALS COLLECTED FOR RECYCLING.—Any moneys re-  
4 ceived by any department, agency, or instrumentality from  
5 the sale of materials collected for the purpose of recycling  
6 shall be available for use by the department, agency or  
7 instrumentality of the executive, legislative and judicial  
8 branches of the Federal Government for activities within  
9 the legal authority of such entity. Nothing in this Act shall  
10 be construed to interfere with existing Federal programs  
11 within the Department of Defense to separate materials  
12 from solid waste for the purpose of recycling.

13 “(b) REPORT.—The Administrator of the Environ-  
14 mental Protection Agency shall annually report to the  
15 Congress with respect to the extent of compliance by each  
16 department, agency, and instrumentality of the executive,  
17 legislative, and judicial branches with the guidelines rec-  
18 ommended under section 6907 of this title for the preced-  
19 ing twelve-month period. Such report shall identify any  
20 such department, agency, and instrumentality which fails  
21 to comply, in whole or in part, with such guidelines. A  
22 copy of the report shall be published in the Federal  
23 Register.

24 “(c) AUTHORIZATION.—For the purpose of enabling  
25 the Administrator of Environmental Protection Agency to

- 1 carry out this section, there are authorized to be appro-
- 2 priated such sums as may be necessary.”.

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
