A BILL

To provide for the repurchase of land taken by eminent domain, by Native American organizations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. OPPORTUNITY TO REPURCHASE SURPLUS**
4 **REAL PROPERTY.**

5 Section 203 of the Federal Property and Administra-
6 tive Service Act of 1949 (40 U.S.C. 484) is amended by
7 adding at the end the following new subsection:

1 “(q) OPPORTUNITY OF NATIVE AMERICANS TO RE-
2 PURCHASE SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY.—

3 “(1) NOTICE.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
4 vision of this section, no surplus real property de-
5 scribed in paragraph (2) shall be disposed of under
6 this section if, not later than 90 days after the date
7 on which the property is declared to be surplus by
8 the United States—

9 “(A) an organization that held the land in
10 trust for the benefit of Native Americans (as
11 defined in section 16(10) of the National Mu-
12 seum of the American Indian Act (20 U.S.C.
13 80q-14(10))) has notified the United States
14 that such organization last held title to the real
15 property prior to the date on which the prop-
16 erty was acquired by the United States by emi-
17 nent domain; and

18 “(B) the organization has made a written
19 offer to purchase the real property at the fair
20 market value of such property on the date of
21 such offer.

22 “(2) PROPERTY AFFECTED.—

23 “(A) IN GENERAL.—Surplus real property
24 referred to in paragraph (1) is surplus real
25 property—

1 “(i) that has been acquired by the
2 United States by eminent domain; and

3 “(ii) title to which was last held by an
4 organization that held the land in trust for
5 the benefit of Native Americans prior to
6 the date on which the property was ac-
7 quired by eminent domain.

8 “(B) DIVIDED PROPERTY.—This sub-
9 section shall apply to real property described in
10 subparagraph (A) and any part of such real
11 property.”.
