Mr. AKAKA introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of the heirs, successors, or assigns of Sadae Tamabayashi.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PAYMENT REQUIRED.**

4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-
5 retary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any money in the
6 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,953
7 to the heirs, successors, and assigns of Sadae
8 Tamabayashi, as their interests may appear, in full satis-
9 faction of all of their claims against the United States for
10 the destruction or loss of property of Sadae Tamabayashi
11 resulting from the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, Ha-

1 waii, on December 7, 1941, or from the defense of Oahu
2 against such attack. The Comptroller General of the Unit-
3 ed States shall determine and certify to the Secretary of
4 the Treasury the status of any person as such an heir,
5 successor, or assignee and the interest of that person in
6 the total amount to be paid under the preceding sentence.

7 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION.**

8 Notwithstanding any contract to the contrary, it shall
9 be unlawful to pay or deliver to any agent or attorney,
10 and for any agent or attorney to receive, on account of
11 services rendered in connection with the claims paid pur-
12 suant to section 1, any amount exceeding 10 percent of
13 the amount so paid. Violation of the provisions of this sec-
14 tion is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed
15 \$1,000.
