Mr. AKAKA introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Ikechukwu J. Ogujiofor, Joy I. Ogujiofor, and Godfrey I. Ogujiofor.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That, in the administration of the Immigration and Na-
4 tionality Act, Ikechukwu J. Ogujiofor, Joy I. Ogujiofor,
5 and Godfrey I. Ogujiofor shall be held and considered to
6 have been lawfully admitted to the United States for per-
7 manent residence as of the date of the enactment of this
8 Act upon payment of the required visa fees. Upon the
9 granting of permanent residence to such aliens as provided
10 for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the

1 proper officer to reduce by the proper number, during the
2 current fiscal year or the fiscal year next following, the
3 total number of immigrant visas which are available to na-
4 tives of the country of the aliens' birth under section
5 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality Act or, if appli-
6 cable, the total number of immigrant visas which are made
7 available to natives of the country of the aliens' birth
8 under section 202(e) of such Act.
