Mr. DOMENICI introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To authorize appropriations for the Department of Defense for fiscal year 1995 for counterproliferation of weapons of mass destruction.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defense
5 Counterproliferation Act of 1994”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITION.**

7 For purposes of this legislation, weapons of mass de-
8 struction are considered to include chemical, biological,
9 and nuclear weapons, their associated components and
10 production facilities, and their delivery systems.

1 **SEC. 3. PROGRAM TO COUNTER THE PROLIFERATION OF**
2 **WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION.**

3 (a) PROGRAM.—The United States shall establish an
4 integrated program in the Department of Defense to
5 counter potential threats to United States interests that
6 arise from the proliferation of weapons of mass destruc-
7 tion. The program will improve the capabilities of the
8 United States to identify, monitor, and respond to the pro-
9 liferation of weapons of mass destruction.

10 (b) MANAGEMENT.—The Secretary of Defense shall
11 designate the Deputy Secretary of Defense as the manager
12 for the program referred to in section (3)(a). The Sec-
13 retary shall prescribe the duties of the Deputy Secretary
14 regarding management of such activities and programs.
15 The duties shall include coordination of
16 counterproliferation activities across all relevant govern-
17 ment agencies.

18 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

19 Funds are authorized to be appropriated for the De-
20 partment of Defense for fiscal year 1995 for the program
21 referred to in section (3)(a) in the amount of
22 \$100,000,000. The amount appropriated pursuant to such
23 authorization of appropriations is authorized to be made
24 available for correcting aspects of such activities and pro-
25 grams that are characterized as shortfalls in the report
26 of the Deputy Secretary of Defense entitled “Report on

1 Nonproliferation and Counterproliferation Activities and
2 Programs”, dated May 1994.

3 **SEC. 5. JOINT COMMITTEE FOR REVIEW OF**
4 **COUNTERPROLIFERATION PROGRAMS OF**
5 **THE UNITED STATES.**

6 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—(1) There is hereby estab-
7 lished a Counterproliferation Program Review Committee
8 composed of the following members:

9 (A) The Secretary of Defense.

10 (B) The Secretary of State.

11 (C) The Secretary of Energy.

12 (D) The Director of Central Intelligence.

13 (E) The Director of the United States Arms
14 Control and Disarmament Agency.

15 (F) The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

16 (2) The Secretary of Defense shall chair the commit-
17 tee.

18 (3) A member of the committee may designate a rep-
19 resentative to perform routinely the duties of the member.
20 A representative shall be in a position of Deputy Assistant
21 Secretary or a position equivalent to or above the level
22 of Deputy Assistant Secretary. A representative of the
23 Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff shall be a person
24 in a grade equivalent to that of Deputy Assistant Sec-
25 retary of Defense.

1 (4) The Secretary of Defense may delegate to the
2 Deputy Secretary of Defense the performance of the du-
3 ties of the Chairman of the committee.

4 (5) The members of the committee shall first meet
5 not later than 30 days after the date of the enactment
6 of this Act. Upon designation of working level officials and
7 representatives, the members of the committee shall joint-
8 ly notify the appropriate committees of Congress that the
9 committee has been constituted. The notification shall
10 identify the representatives designated pursuant to para-
11 graph (3) and the working level officials of the committee.

12 (b) PURPOSES OF THE COMMITTEE.—The purposes
13 of the committee are—

14 (1) to optimize funding for, and ensure the de-
15 velopment and deployment of highly effective tech-
16 nologies and capabilities for the counterproliferation
17 of weapons of mass destruction; and

18 (2) to identify and eliminate undesirable
19 redundancies or uncoordinated efforts in the devel-
20 opment and deployment of such technologies and ca-
21 pabilities.

22 (c) DUTIES.—The committee shall—

23 (1) identify and review existing and proposed
24 capabilities and technologies for support of United
25 States counterproliferation policy with regard to—

- 1 (A) intelligence;
- 2 (B) battlefield surveillance;
- 3 (C) passive defenses;
- 4 (D) active defenses; and
- 5 (E) counterforce capabilities;

6 (2) as part of the review pursuant to paragraph
7 (1), identify deficiencies in existing capabilities and
8 technologies;

9 (3) formulate near-term, mid-term, and long-
10 term programmatic options for meeting require-
11 ments established by the committee and eliminating
12 deficiencies identified by the committee; and

13 (4) in carrying out the other duties of the com-
14 mittee, ensure that all types of counterproliferation
15 actions are considered.

16 (d) ACCESS TO INFORMATION.—The committee shall
17 have access to information on all programs, projects, and
18 activities of the Department of Defense, the Department
19 of State, the Department of Energy, the intelligence com-
20 munity, and the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency
21 that are pertinent to the purposes and duties of the com-
22 mittee.

23 (e) BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS.—The committee
24 may submit to the officials referred to in subsection (a)
25 any recommendation regarding existing or planned budg-

1 ets as the committee considers appropriate to encourage
2 funding for capabilities and technologies at the level nec-
3 essary to support United States counterproliferation
4 policy.

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
