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## AN ACT

To provide for the minting of coins to commemorate the  
World University Games.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “World University  
5 Games Commemorative Coin Act of 1993”.

1 **SEC. 2. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.**

2 (a) FIVE-DOLLAR GOLD COINS.—

3 (1) ISSUANCE.—The Secretary of the Treasury  
4 (hereinafter in this Act referred to as the “Sec-  
5 retary”) shall issue not more than 200,000 five-dol-  
6 lar coins which shall—

7 (A) weigh 8.359 grams;

8 (B) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and

9 (C) contain 90 percent gold and 10 percent  
10 alloy.

11 (2) DESIGN.—The design of such five-dollar  
12 coins shall be emblematic of the participation of  
13 American athletes in the World University Games.  
14 On each such coin there shall be a designation of the  
15 value of the coin, an inscription of the year “1993”,  
16 and inscriptions of the words “Liberty”, “In God  
17 We Trust”, “United States of America”, and “E  
18 Pluribus Unum”.

19 (b) ONE-DOLLAR SILVER COINS.—

20 (1) ISSUANCE.—The Secretary shall issue not  
21 more than 750,000 one-dollar coins which shall—

22 (A) weigh 26.73 grams;

23 (B) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and

24 (C) contain 90 percent silver and 10 per-  
25 cent copper.

1           (2) DESIGN.—The design of such dollar coins  
2 shall be emblematic of the participation of American  
3 athletes in the World University Games. On each  
4 such coin there shall be a designation of the value  
5 of the coin, an inscription of the year “1993”, and  
6 inscriptions of the words “Liberty”, “In God We  
7 Trust”, “United States of America”, and “E  
8 Pluribus Unum”.

9           (c) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins issued under this  
10 Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of  
11 title 31, United States Code.

12 **SEC. 3. SOURCES OF BULLION.**

13           (a) SILVER BULLION.—The Secretary shall obtain  
14 silver for the coins minted under this Act only from stock-  
15 piles established under the Strategic and Critical Mate-  
16 rials Stock Piling Act (50 U.S.C. 98 et seq.).

17           (b) GOLD BULLION.—The Secretary shall obtain gold  
18 for the coins minted under this Act pursuant to the au-  
19 thority of the Secretary under existing law.

20 **SEC. 4. SELECTION OF DESIGN.**

21           The design for each coin authorized by this Act shall  
22 be selected by the Secretary, after consultation with the  
23 Greater Buffalo Athletic Corporation and the Commission  
24 of Fine Arts. As required under section 5135 of title 31,

1 United States Code, the design shall also be reviewed by  
2 the Citizens Commemorative Advisory Committee.

3 **SEC. 5. SALE OF THE COINS.**

4 (a) SALE PRICE.—The coins issued under this Act  
5 shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the face  
6 value, plus the cost of designing and issuing such coins  
7 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, and  
8 overhead expenses).

9 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk  
10 sales at a reasonable discount.

11 (c) PREPAID ORDERS AT A DISCOUNT.—The Sec-  
12 retary shall accept prepaid orders for the coins prior to  
13 the issuance of such coins. Sales under this subsection  
14 shall be at a reasonable discount.

15 (d) SURCHARGE REQUIRED.—All sales shall include  
16 a surcharge of \$35 per coin for the five-dollar coins and  
17 \$7 per coin for the one-dollar coins.

18 **SEC. 6. ISSUANCE OF THE COINS.**

19 (a) GOLD COINS.—The five-dollar coins authorized  
20 under this Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof  
21 qualities and shall be struck at the United States Bullion  
22 Depository at West Point.

23 (b) SILVER COINS.—The one-dollar coins authorized  
24 under this Act may be issued in uncirculated and proof

1 qualities, except that not more than 1 facility of the Unit-  
2 ed States Mint may be used to strike each such quality.

3 (c) COMMENCEMENT OF ISSUANCE.—The coins au-  
4 thorized and minted under this Act may be issued begin-  
5 ning on July 1, 1993.

6 (d) TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY.—Coins may not  
7 be minted under this Act after June 30, 1994.

8 **SEC. 7. GENERAL WAIVER OF PROCUREMENT REGULA-**  
9 **TIONS.**

10 No provision of law governing procurement or public  
11 contracts shall be applicable to the procurement of goods  
12 or services necessary for carrying out the provisions of this  
13 Act. Nothing in this section shall relieve any person enter-  
14 ing into a contract under the authority of this Act from  
15 complying with any law relating to equal employment op-  
16 portunity.

17 **SEC. 8. DISTRIBUTION OF SURCHARGES.**

18 All surcharges which are received by the Secretary  
19 from the sale of coins issued under this Act shall be  
20 promptly paid by the Secretary to the Greater Buffalo  
21 Athletic Corporation. Such amounts shall be used by the  
22 Greater Buffalo Athletic Corporation to support local or  
23 community amateur athletic programs, to erect facilities  
24 for the use of such athletes, and to underwrite the cost  
25 of sponsoring the World University Games.

1 **SEC. 9. AUDITS.**

2 The Comptroller General shall have the right to ex-  
3 amine such books, records, documents, and other data of  
4 the Greater Buffalo Athletic Corporation as may be relat-  
5 ed to the expenditures of amounts paid under section 8.

6 **SEC. 10. NUMISMATIC PUBLIC ENTERPRISE FUND.**

7 The coins issued under this Act are subject to the  
8 provisions section 5134 of title 31, United States Code,  
9 relating to the Numismatic Public Enterprise Fund.

10 **SEC. 11. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.**

11 It is the sense of the Congress that this coin program  
12 should be self-sustaining and should be administered in  
13 a manner that results in no net cost to the Numismatic  
14 Public Enterprise Fund.
