Mrs. BOXER introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a salmon captive broodstock program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Winter Run Chinook
5 Salmon Captive Broodstock Act of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF SALMON CAPTIVE**
7 **BROODSTOCK PROGRAM.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subsection (d), the Sec-
9 retary of the Interior (hereinafter in this section referred
10 to as the “Secretary”) shall conduct in accordance with

1 this section a salmon captive broodstock program (herein-
2 after in this section referred to as the “Program”).

3 (b) PROGRAM.—The program shall be carried out in
4 a manner that is consistent with the goals, priorities, and
5 policies set forth in any recovery plan for winter run Chi-
6 nook salmon in the Sacramento River developed by the
7 National Marine Fisheries Service under the Endangered
8 Species Act of 1973, and with findings of consultations
9 regarding that population of salmon carried out pursuant
10 to section 7 of that Act.

11 (c) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary shall consult
12 with the Winter Run Chinook Salmon Captive Broodstock
13 Committee (a committee identified in the document enti-
14 tled “Biological Assessment on the Effects of Coleman
15 National Fish Hatchery Operations on Winter Run Chi-
16 nook Salmon”, prepared by the United States Fish and
17 Wildlife Service) in making management decisions regard-
18 ing the Program.

19 (d) STATE MATCHING.—The Secretary may not im-
20 plement this section unless not less than 20 percent of
21 amounts necessary to conduct the Program are provided
22 by non-Federal sources.

23 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
24 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to con-

- 1 duct the Program \$1,000,000 for each of fiscal years
- 2 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998.

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
