## A BILL

To amend section 922 of title 18, United States Code, to make unlawful a person's failure to comply with firearm purchase requirements after moving to a new State of residence.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the "Interstate Gun Control  
5       Enforcement Act of 1994".

1 **SEC. 2. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH FIREARM PURCHASE**  
2 **REQUIREMENTS IN NEW STATE OF RESI-**  
3 **DENCE.**

4 Section 922 of title 18, United States Code, is  
5 amended by adding at the end the following new sub-  
6 section:

7 “(v)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to trans-  
8 port or cause to be transported into a State and thereafter  
9 to possess in the State a firearm any part or component  
10 of which has been transported in or has been the object  
11 of a transaction affecting interstate commerce if—

12 “(A) the law of the State into which the firearm  
13 is transported requires a person to obtain a permit  
14 to purchase a firearm; and

15 “(B)(i) within 10 business days after entering  
16 the State with intent to reside in the State for a pe-  
17 riod of more than 30 days, the person does not sub-  
18 mit an application for such a permit, or another per-  
19 mit for which the standards and procedures for ap-  
20 proval are equivalent to a permit to purchase; or

21 “(ii) such an application has been denied, and  
22 a period of more than 5 business days has elapsed  
23 since the person received notice of the denial.”.
