A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to issue regulations concerning use of the term “fresh” in the labeling of poultry, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Truth in Poultry La-
5 beling Act of 1994”.

6 **SEC. 2. REGULATIONS ON LABELING OF POULTRY.**

7 Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment
8 of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture shall issue final
9 regulations under the Poultry Product Inspection Act (21

1 U.S.C. 451 et seq.) that prohibit the use of the term
2 “fresh” on labeling of any poultry or poultry part, or of
3 any edible portion of the poultry or part, that has been
4 frozen or previously frozen to below 26 degrees Fahr-
5 enheit.
