## A BILL

To encourage serious negotiations between the major league baseball players and the owners of major league baseball in order to prevent a strike by the players or a lockout by the owners so that the fans will be able to enjoy the remainder of the baseball season, the playoffs, and the World Series.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Baseball Fans Protec-  
5 tion Act of 1994”.

1 **SEC. 2. APPLICATION OF THE ANTITRUST LAWS TO MAJOR**  
2 **LEAGUE BASEBALL IN EXCEPTIONAL AND EX-**  
3 **TRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES.**

4 The Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. 12 et seq.) is amended  
5 by adding at the end the following new section:

6 “SEC. 27. (a) IN GENERAL.—In the event that a uni-  
7 lateral term or condition is imposed by any party that has  
8 been subject to an agreement between the owners of major  
9 league baseball and the labor organization representing  
10 the players of major league baseball, the antitrust laws  
11 shall apply to that term or condition.

12 “(b) TERMINATION OF EFFECTIVENESS.—Sub-  
13 section (a) shall cease to be effective upon the mutual  
14 adoption of an agreement between the owners of major  
15 league baseball and the labor organization representing  
16 the players of major league baseball to replace the basic  
17 agreement between the two parties that expired on Decem-  
18 ber 31, 1993, but subsection (a) shall continue to apply  
19 to conduct occurring prior to the adoption of such an  
20 agreement.

21 “(c) DEFINITION.—In this section, ‘term or condi-  
22 tion’ does not include a strike or a lockout.”.
