A BILL

For the relief of Clayton Timothy Boyle and Clayton Louis Boyle, son and father.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. WAIVER OF PERIOD OF LIMITATION.**

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 2401 of
5 title 28, United States Code, or any other legal or equi-
6 table bar or limitation, the United States District Court
7 for the District of Hawaii shall have jurisdiction (as other-
8 wise conferred by section 1346(b) of title 28, United
9 States Code) to hear, determine, and render a judgment
10 for damages upon any claims of Clayton Timothy Boyle

1 and his father, Clayton Louis Boyle, of Honolulu, Hawaii,
2 against the United States of America, arising out of inju-
3 ries allegedly suffered by Clayton Timothy Boyle as the
4 result of the failure of the United States Navy to provide
5 proper diagnostic care or medical treatment on or about
6 November, 1965.

7 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION.**

8 Suit upon any claims described in section 1 may be
9 brought at any time on or before 180 days after the date
10 of enactment of this Act.

11 **SEC. 3. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.**

12 Nothing in this Act shall be construed as an admis-
13 sion of liability on the part of the United States.

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
