Mr. SIMON (for himself, Mr. HATCH, Mr. DECONCINI, and Mr. METZENBAUM) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To prohibit certain political activities of certain Federal officers in the Office of National Drug Control Policy.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Office of National
5 Drug Control Policy Political Activities Act of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITIONS ON POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1003(a)(2) of the Anti-
8 Drug Abuse Act of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1502) is amended—

9 (1) by inserting “(A)” after “(2)”; and

1 (2) by adding at the end thereof the following
2 new subparagraph:

3 “(B) The Director, the Deputy Director for De-
4 mand Reduction, the Deputy Director for Supply
5 Reduction, and the Associate Director for National
6 Drug Control Policy shall not take an active part in
7 political management or in political campaigns. No
8 later than 90 days after the date of the enactment
9 of this subparagraph, the Director of the Office of
10 Personnel Management shall promulgate regulations
11 prescribing what actions constitute an active part in
12 political management or in political campaigns for
13 purposes of this subparagraph.”.

14 (b) AMENDMENT TO HATCH ACT PROVISIONS.—Sec-
15 tion 7324(d) of title 5, United States Code, is amended—

16 (1) in paragraph (1) by inserting before the
17 semicolon “, except for an employee as provided
18 under section 1003(a)(2)(B) of the Anti-Drug Abuse
19 Act of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1502(a)(2))”;

20 (2) in paragraph (3) by inserting before the
21 semicolon “, except for an employee as provided
22 under section 1003(a)(2)(B) of the Anti-Drug Abuse
23 Act of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1502(a)(2))”.
