Mr. PRESSLER introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice
and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

To designate September 17, 1993, as “Diplomatic Courier
Day”.

Whereas September 17, 1993, marks the 75th anniversary of
the establishment of the United States Diplomatic Courier
Service of the Department of State;

Whereas the United States Diplomatic Courier Service very
ably carries the classified documents and sensitive equip-
ment of the United States Government to embassies and
consulates all over the world;

Whereas the United States Diplomatic Courier Service pro-
vides a secure communication link between the United
States Government and its overseas missions in times of
war and in times of peace;

Whereas the United States Diplomatic Courier Service is re-
sponsible for the safe passage of classified documents

across international borders for all agencies of the United States Government; and

Whereas the secure transportation of classified materials across international borders by the United States Diplomatic Courier Service enhances security at all United States Government facilities overseas: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That September 17, 1993, is hereby designated as “Diplo-
4 matic Courier Day”. The President is authorized and re-
5 quested to issue a proclamation calling upon the Depart-
6 ment of State and its overseas missions to observe such
7 day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
