## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Designating the week beginning May 1, 1994 as “Arson Awareness Week”.

Whereas fires annually cause nearly 6,000 deaths and \$10,000,000,000 in property damage in the United States;

Whereas the United States has higher fire property loss per capita than any other industrialized country;

Whereas there are 100,000 known incendiary fires, 50,000 incendiary vehicle fires, and 25,000 incendiary wildland fires annually in the United States;

Whereas arson is responsible for approximately 25 percent of all fires in the United States;

Whereas one of the leading causes of fire deaths in the United States is arson, which accounts for over 700 deaths annually in the United States;

Whereas arson is the leading cause of property damage due to fire in the United States, and is responsible for losses of \$2,000,000,000 or approximately \$1 of every \$4 lost to fire, annually in the United States;

Whereas, according to the National Fire Protection Association, only one third of the suspicious and incendiary fires in the United States are confirmed as arson;

Whereas 13 of the 22 fire storms in Southern California in October and November of 1993 were caused by arson, and resulted in over 126,000 burned acres, \$320,000,000 in damage, and injury to 97 people; and

Whereas a week set aside for arson awareness would increase public knowledge about the large impact of the crime:  
Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That the week beginning May 1, 1994, is designated as  
4       “Arson Awareness Week”, and the President is authorized  
5       and requested to issue a proclamation calling on all public  
6       officials and the people of the United States to observe  
7       the week with appropriate programs and activities.
