Mr. JOHNSTON (by request) introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

To approve the location of a World War II Memorial.

Whereas section 6(a) of the Act entitled “To provide standards for placement of commemorative works on certain Federal lands in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes,” approved November 14, 1986 (Public Law 99–652, 100 Stat. 3650), provides that the location of a commemorative work in the area described therein as Area I shall be deemed disapproved unless the location is approved by law not later than one hundred and fifty days after the Secretary of the Interior or the Administrator of General Services notifies the Congress of his determination that the commemorative work may be located in Area I; and

Whereas Public Law 103–32, approved May 25, 1993 (107 Stat. 90), authorized the American Battle Monuments

Commission to establish a memorial on Federal land in the District of Columbia to members of the Armed Forces who served in World War II; and

Whereas the Secretary of the Interior has notified the Congress of his determination that the memorial may be located in Area I: Now, therefore, be it

1        *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2        *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3        That the location of a World War II Memorial, author-  
4        ized by Public Law 103–32, within either Area I or Area  
5        II as described in Public Law 99–652 (100 Stat. 3650),  
6        is hereby approved.
