1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*
4 *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*
5 *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*
6 *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution if ratified*
7 *by the conventions of three-fourths of the several States*
8 *within seven years after its submission to the States for*
9 *ratification:*
