Mr. MITCHELL (for himself and Mr. DOLE) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

To authorize the production of records by the Select Committee on Intelligence.

Whereas the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania has requested, through the United States Attorney, that the Select Committee on Intelligence make available to the Court for in camera inspection a transcript of testimony received by the Committee in closed session to determine the relevance of the transcript to the case of United States v. Robert Clyde Ivy, Cr. No. 91-602-04, pending in that court;

Whereas by the privileges of the Senate of the United States and rule XI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, no evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate can, by administrative or judicial process, be taken

from such control or possession but by permission of the Senate; and

Whereas when it appears that documents, papers, and records under the control or in the possession of the Senate may promote the administration of justice, the Senate will take such action as will promote the ends of justice consistently with the privileges of the Senate: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Chairman and Vice Chairman of
2 the Select Committee on Intelligence, acting jointly, are
3 authorized to provide to the United States District Court
4 for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, in accordance
5 with appropriate security procedures, the closed session
6 transcript which the court has requested.
