Mr. RIEGLE (for himself and Mr. LEVIN) submitted the following resolution;
which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

RESOLUTION

To express the sense of the Senate that May 18, 1994,
should be recognized as “Senior Power Day”.

Whereas Senior Power Day is a Michigan organization which annually brings together 4,000 to 8,000 senior citizens in order to educate them about issues concerning senior citizens and to communicate with Federal and State lawmakers about those issues;

Whereas Senior Power Day is officially recognized by the White House Conference on Aging;

Whereas on May 18, 1994, Senior Power Day again will gather at the State Capitol in Lansing, Michigan;

Whereas this year’s gathering is the 20th such gathering;

Whereas the theme of this year’s gathering is “Senior Power: Celebrating 20 Years of Effective Advocacy”;

Whereas as part of this year's gathering, Senior Power Day will host a hearing of the Special Committee on Aging of the United States Senate; and

Whereas Senior Power Day advocates issues of concern to citizens of all ages and has emphasized the need to adopt a national health insurance plan and has stressed the intergenerational benefits of adequate health care, long-term care, and school reform: Now, therefore, be it
