Mr. LOTT (for himself, Mr. BREAU, Mr. COCHRAN, Mr. HEFLIN, Mr. JOHNSTON, Mr. NUNN, Mr. CRAIG, Mr. PRESSLER, and Mr. SHELBY) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

To express the sense of the Senate concerning phasing in implementation of Forest Management Plans by the Department of Agriculture.

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the Senate that—

2 (1) the Secretary of Agriculture shall, in con-
3 nection with each proposed forest management
4 change proposed, recognize the multiple uses of the
5 National Forests;

6 (2) the Secretary of Agriculture shall phase in
7 to the greatest extent practicable each forest man-
8 agement change that would amend or revise a forest
9 plan to provide for a diversity of plant and animal

1 communities in a particular National Forest or dis-
2 trict of the Forest Service; and

3 (3) to the extent authorized by law prior to im-
4 plementation of such changes, the Secretary of Agri-
5 culture shall consider such factors as, economic con-
6 sequences faced by affected communities, the impact
7 on state and local revenues, and the agency's finan-
8 cial resources which are available for implementa-
9 tion.
